In addition to their ethical and legal responsibilities, journalists must know how to research and to work well with others.

They may work on layout, photography and sub-editing, as well as write stories. We should be full participants, not just the lurking overlords of top-down media. Entry with a postgraduate degree is possible, especially if it's an NCTJ-accredited qualification or includes relevant work experience. This is a role that serves the long tail of information, because we never know what other individuals might find useful, important or necessary. Geographical mobility is important, especially at the beginning of a journalism career. Journalists help stir up discussions that might later lead to change and problem solving. You can be recruited directly by employers on to a two-year training contract, although these opportunities are increasingly rare. Working hours Journalists quite frequently work long or unsocial hours. Comprehensive Reporting As Pew Research states, journalists create a type of map of events, making it easier for citizens to navigate through the important research. They report on news and politics, as well as on sports, arts and culture, science and business. Because of the need to sometimes work long and unpredictable hours, anything up to 50 to 60 hours per week, journalists' social and working lives may become intertwined. Journalists must strive to present an accurate, well-balanced explanation of the stories they cover. This has become more prevalent with the advent of social media and blogs, as well as other platforms that are used to manipulate or sway social and political opinions and policies. The conversation-starter role should become explicit in our job descriptions. The majority of new entrants to the newspaper journalism industry are graduates. Many jobs receive little advertising, so networking, internships and speculative applications including samples of published work are advisable.
